TAG QUESTIONS: GRAMMAR

POSITIVE + NEGATIVE (SAME AUX VERB)

- This is a tag question, isn't it?
- She lives in Shimane, doesn't she?
- You have been to Tokyo, haven't you?
- They will understand this lesson, won't they?

NEGATIVE + POSITIVE (SAME AUX VERB)

- This isn't a normal question, is it?
- She doesn't live in Hamada, does she?
- You haven't been to Okinawa, have you?
- They can't understand this lesson, can they?

MAKE A TAG QUESTION

1. You don't like animals, **do you?**
2. You eat chocolate, **don't you?**
3. We shouldn't be here, **should we?**
4. You haven't seen this TV show, **have you?**
5. They aren't coming, **are they?**

TAG QUESTIONS: INTONATION

FALLING: MORE CERTAIN (Accusatory)

- This is a tag question, isn't it? ▼
- You didn't finish your homework, did you? ▼
- You haven't seen this topic before, have you? ▼

RISING: LESS CERTAIN (Checking info)

- She lives in Shimane, doesn't she? ▲
- You have been to Tokyo, haven't you? ▲
- You haven't been to Okinawa, have you? ▲
